

The Workshop Programme

Workshops run from 4:30pm on Tuesday 14th August until 6pm on Friday 17th August. There will be a small programme of introductory workshops on Saturday 18th August. See opposite page for details of workshops taking place outside the workshop spaces.

There will be meetings for the whole Camp to discuss the Days of Action at 4:15pm on Wednesday 15th and from 2pm to 5pm on Saturday 18th.
