## Refreshments

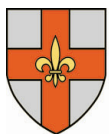

### Chair - Terry Miller

As Chaplain for Environmental Issues and Sustainable Development he has worked with many organisations and communities on sustainable solutions. He was a delegate at Rio +10 in Johannesburg in 2002. Recently he has completed a research thesis on environmental motivation and behaviour.



### Keynote Speaker - Pam Lunn

Until her retirement a few months ago Pam worked for many years at Woodbrooke, the Quaker adult study centre in Birmingham. Following a decade of being Programme Co-ordinator, she was most recently co-creator and programme Leader of the *Good Lives Project*. Pam is author of *Costing Not Less Than Everything: sustainability and spirituality in challenging times* (2011).



### Keynote Speaker - Karen Lowthrop MBE

Karen is Chief Executive Officer and co-founder of Hill Holt Wood, an internationally renowned environmental social enterprise. As a community-owned business it illustrates how to use woodland resources to affect rural regeneration, develop an educational resource, and create a sustainable local economy. She was awarded the MBE in 2011 for services to Social Enterprise.
